What is the deception?

The idea of "deceive" in these contexts is clear: to be "deceived" is to be blinded to the reality of one's religious state. People can think that they are right with God when they really are not. And so it is for those people who "hear" the word – regular church attenders, seminary students, and even seminary professors – but do not "do" it. They are mistaken in thinking that they are truly right with God. For God's word cannot be divided into parts. If one wants the benefits of its saving power, one must also embrace it as a guide for life. The person who fails to do the word, James therefore suggests, is a person who has not truly accepted God's word at all.
