Truth: True faith in Jesus Christ produces good works

What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? (2:14)

But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together in Christ—by grace you have been saved through faith . . . and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God.
