# LEADERS NEEDED - PATTERN

Example #1 Acts 6:1-7

## \_\_\_ / Change Occurs

- 2:41 those who received his word were baptized, and there were added about 3000 souls!
- 4:4 many who heard the word believed, and the number of the men came to about 5000!
- 5:14 more than ever believers were added to the Lord, <u>multitudes of</u> both men and women!
- 6:1 now in these days the disciples were increasing in number!

#### Needed

a complaint by the Hellenists arose against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. The twelve said pick out from among you seven men whom we will appoint to this duty."

### Example #2 Acts 11:19-26

## Growth / Change Occurs

11:21 In Anticoh . . . a great number who believed turned to the Lord!

#### Leaders Needed

11:22 The report of this came to the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch ... and he exhorted them ...

## Growth/Change Occurs

11:24 <u>a great many people</u> were added to the Lord

#### Leaders Needed

11:25 Barnabas went to look for Saul . . . and for a whole year they met with the church and taught a great many people.


- 13:1-2 the Holy Spirit sent Barnabas and Saul to Cyprus
- 20:28 the Holy Spirit has made you overseers to care for the church of God which He purchased with His own blood.

## Component #2

the seven men. laid hands on them

6:5-6 chose seven men, laid hands on them 13:3 laid hands on them and sent them off
