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GIFT EXERCISE

Jesus came as a baby at Christmas so He could become the Savior as a man. After He accomplished that goal, He left the mission in our hands, so to speak. He chooses to use flawed people like us to spread the Good News of His salvation.

How do you respond to the idea of "sharing" the gospel? Do you feel hope and energy about that? Or do you feel fear? Guilt? Apathy? Take those feelings to God and ask Him to give you His perspective on *your* involvement in His mission. What does that look like for you—with your personality, your strengths, your limitations?

Take time to think through—and maybe even write down—your personal testimony of faith in Jesus and the difference He makes in your life. That's what being a witness is—telling what you have experienced. That's not so hard. Now, share that testimony with someone else:

- Think of someone you want to share the Good News with.
- Think of the best way to give your testimony to that person. It may be in person. It may be over Skype or Google Hangout or Facetime. It may be writing a letter or an email. What would it look like on Twitter or Instagram?
- Pray and ask God to prepare the way for the Good News to be heard—*really* heard. And pray for your own heart, that you will not attach yourself to the results. Saving people is God's part. Sharing the Good News is your part.
- Share your testimony with the person. Offer the truth of Jesus in the context of your life and experience. Invite him/her to ask questions.

Think of 2015 in terms of *your* ultimate purpose. How can you incorporate sharing the truth about Jesus into your life this year in a way that is most natural and exciting for you?
