GIFT EXERCISE

PERFECT PROMISE

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet . . . Matthew 1:22

Set aside specific time for solitude this week. Make this an intentional early part of your Christmas season. Put it on your list, give your word, choose a special place—whatever motivates you to make it a priority.

- Ask God to make this Christmas season one like no other. He can do that even if it is your busiest time of year.
- Ask Him to make this a Christmas where you learn of Jesus in new ways—to fill you with anticipation for that.
- Ask Him to prepare you to give to others out of what you are learning about Jesus and all that He is for you.

- What is my point of need, longing—right now? Honestly get in touch with my own heart . . .
- How is God's promise "more" than what I am focused on? What does God want to do that is different than my desire for deliverance, relief, solutions? How can I see Jesus as the answer?
- What is God's Word to me in Jesus? What real promise from God is mine? Ask Him to open your eyes to that. Dig for that in scripture. Have others work with you on that. Hold on to that.
