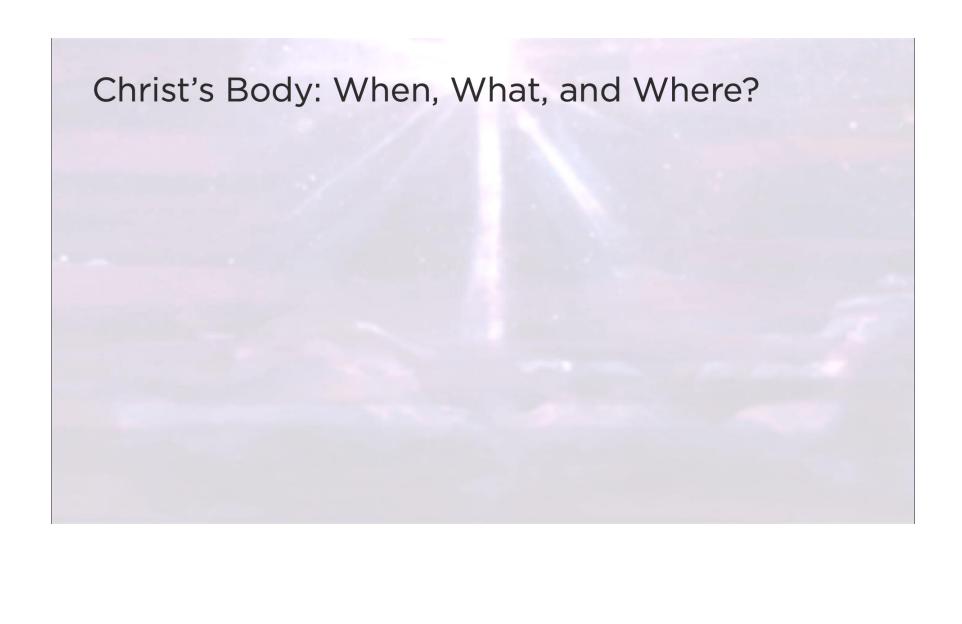

Condemned

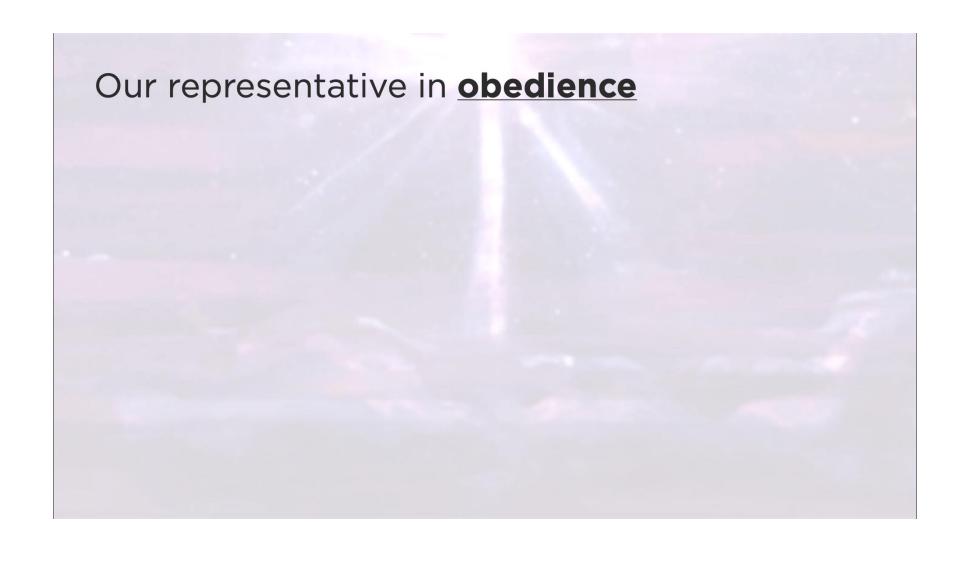
Eutychianism.

Re-affirmed Nicaea, condemned Apollinarianism.

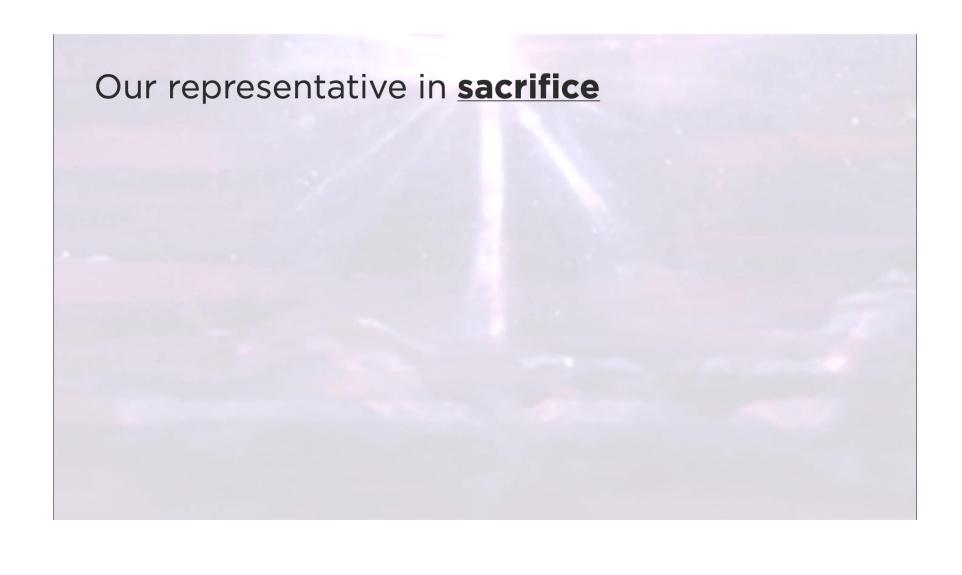
Soteriological Axiom: "That which is not assumed is not healed."

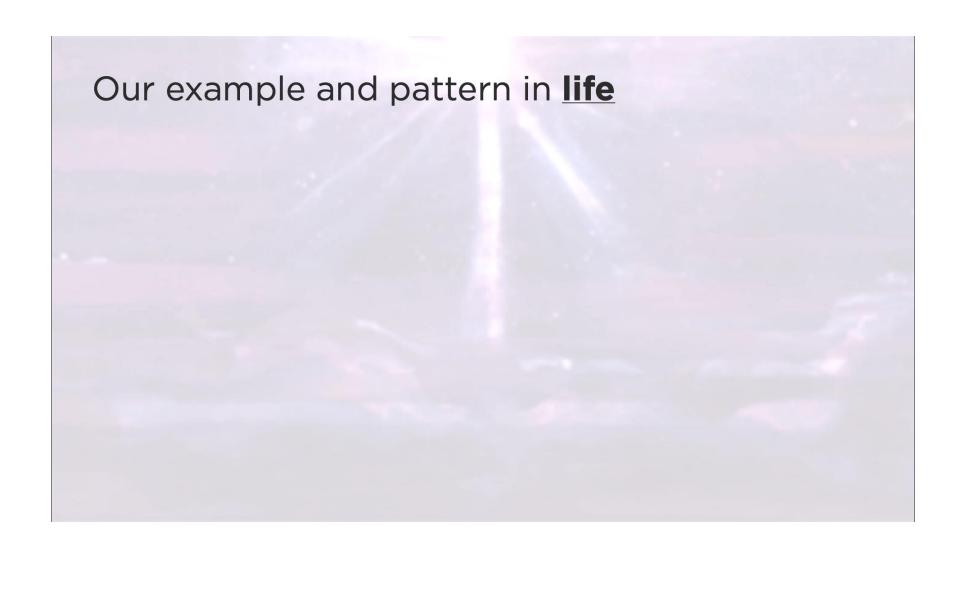

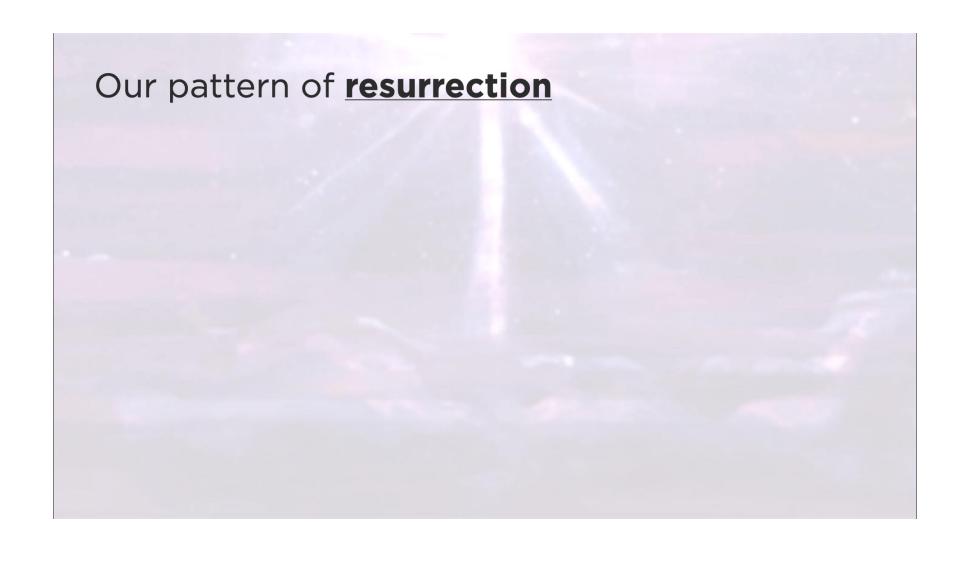

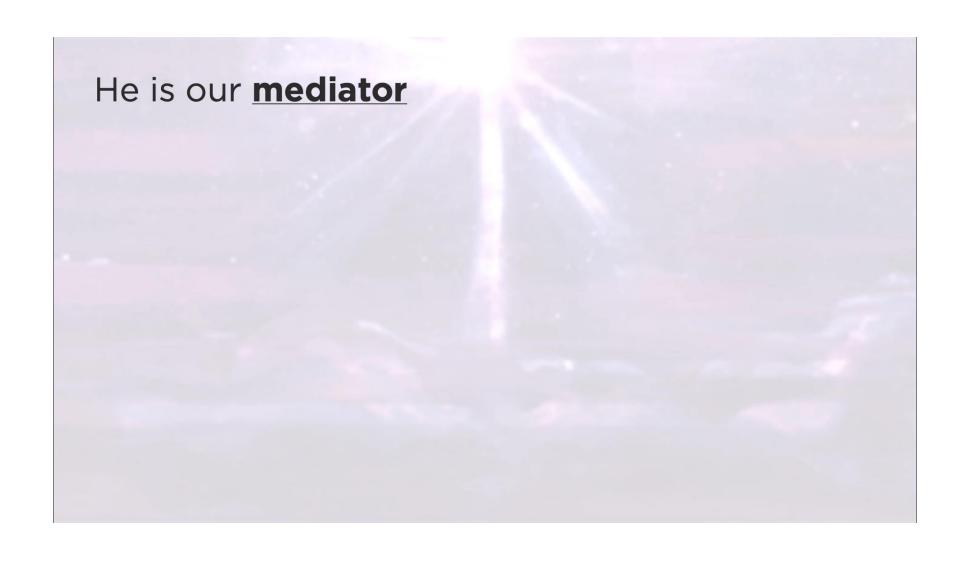


Our pattern of resurrection
