

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

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Luke 15:1-2

Younger Son		

Sinfulness → "came to his senses"(17)

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 "My son was lost—(and he was willing to admit it)—and now he's found!" (24)



Older Son

Hears the celebration → "angry...
refuses to go in"(28)

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- Hears the celebration → "angry...
 refuses to go in"(28)
- Father → "entreats him" (28)
- "Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command" (29)

We still believe that our seat at the table is won in part due to our relative goodness.

Entrance isn't based on **what you've done** but **how you come**.

- Who is the person near me that Jesus would be inviting/welcoming, but I'm not? Am I "in my own universe," or am I inviting others into my community?
- Which of the disconnects most resonates with my current experience? What truth about the Host do I need to most reflect on to re-warm my heart for those around me?
