





Case Study - Meekness

Meekness = <u>faith</u> + <u>patience</u> → <u>gentleness</u>

Confidence in God's <u>timing</u> and <u>provision</u> enables us to refuse to take <u>shortcuts</u> and respond with gentleness.

○ provision - stones → bread

Meekness makes no sense when it is **severed** from the **story**.
