1. Who were they instructed to focus on first? → The \_\_\_\_\_ (5-6)
  - \_\_\_\_\_: “Go nowhere among the Gentiles and . . . Samaritans”
  - \_\_\_\_\_: “The lost sheep of the house of Israel”
    - Ezekiel 34:2-6 –
    - Jeremiah 23:16-18 –
2. What were they told to do? → The \_\_\_\_\_ (7-8)
  - \_\_\_\_\_: “proclaim . . . the kingdom of heaven is at hand”
  - \_\_\_\_\_: “heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons”
  - \_\_\_\_\_: “you received without paying; give without pay”
3. How were they supposed to get ready? → The \_\_\_\_\_ (8b-10)
  - \_\_\_\_\_ **light**: “acquire no gold or silver or copper for your belts”
  - \_\_\_\_\_ **nothing extra**: “no bag for your journey, or two tunics or sandals or a staff”
  - \_\_\_\_\_ **and** \_\_\_\_\_: “For the laborer is worthy of his food”
4. Where were they told to stay / get food? → The \_\_\_\_\_ (11-13a)
  - With \_\_\_\_\_ people – “find out who is worthy in it and stay there”
  - Whom they had \_\_\_\_\_ –
5. How were they to respond to rejection / opposition? → The \_\_\_\_\_ (13b-15)
