What is the "kingdom of heaven"?

The Kingdom of God is where what <u>God</u> wants gets <u>done</u>.

"Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." Matthew 6:10

The Parables

- 1. The *hidden treasure* "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field..." (44a)
- 2. The *pearl* "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls..." (45)
- 3. The <u>net</u> "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea..." (47a)

The Kingdom of God is ...

- weak, but *strong*
- small, but *large*
- lost, but *found*
- hidden, but *valuable*
- old, but <u>new</u>
- priceless, yet *not for sale*
- already, but *<u>not yet</u>*

Why we need this sense of irony:

- 1. We are *easily distracted* -
- 2. We need to see the importance of small things because we are small -

The irony of the Kingdom is made of two truths that appear to contradict each other:

- The Kingdom is *more important* than anything else.
- The Kingdom doesn't always look more important than everything else.

To say it another way:

- What God wants is the *most important* thing for us.
- But what God wants may not look so important to us.
