
The people at Nazareth

astonished = to amaze ekplesso - lit. "to strike out" The people at Nazareth



"took offense" = skandalizo stumblingblock, to trip or trap "took offense" = skandalizo stumblingblock, to trip or trap to offend = to cause someone to pull away or distrust someone who is trustworthy Jesus's response -


Jesus's response Jesus lamented their <u>lack of honor</u>.


Jesus was so <u>ordinary</u> for the first 30 years of his life that his family and neighbors viewed him as <u>one of them</u>.







"Our mood was downbeat. I looked out the window at the Ferris wheel of the Great America amusement park revolving in the distance,
